Incomes of municipal or other local corporations, dividends and profits of savings banks, funds and incomes of trades unions or friendly societies, or of ecclesiastical, charitable, or educational bodies of a public character, incomes derived from Government stock, accruing to persons not resident in New South Wales, are all exempt from taxation. Private persons are entitled to have deducted from their taxable incomes, outgoings actually incurred in the colony in the production of their incomes and premiums not exceeding £50 on life assurance or fidelity guarantees. No deduction is to be made for the maintenance of a family or establishment, domestic or private expenses, loss recoverable under insurance, income and land tax, or income earned in the colony and carried to reserve or capitalised. In order to ascertain the sum on which income tax is payable, the amount of income from all sources received in the preceding year shall be the basis of calculation; no tax is payable in respect of income earned outside New South Wales.

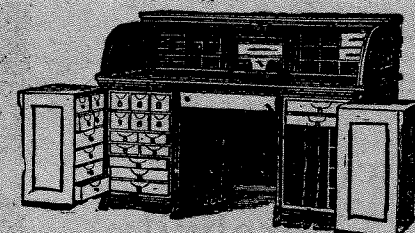

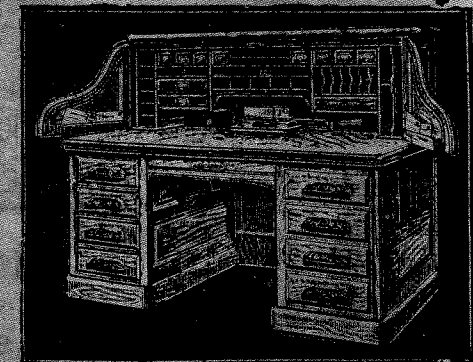
