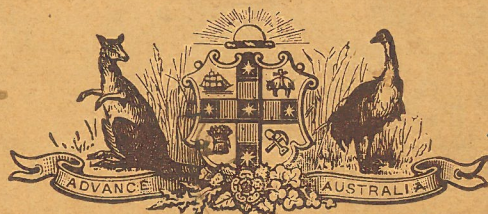

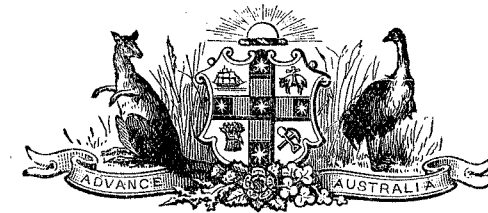

ECLIPSES IN 1905.

Of the SUN, Two; Moon, Two.
I. FEBRUARY 19. Partial Eclipse of the Moon. Visible in Europe, Asia, Africa, and Australia.

Moon enters shadow 5h 54m p.m.
Moon leaves shadow 8h 6m p.m.

The Moon rises at London at 5h 16m p.m.

II. MARCH 6. Annular Eclipse of the Sun. The line of Annular Eclipse passes South of Kerguelen, crosses Australia from the Head of the Great Bight to Port Bowen, and thence to the Loyalty Isles. Visible as a Partial Eclipse in South-East Africa, South of Madagascar, Sumatra and Borneo, the whole of Australia and New Zealand.

Ends ... 8h 6m a.m., 152° E., 5° S.

In South-East Africa the Sun rises eclipsed.

III. AUGUST 15. Partial Eclipse of the Moon. The whole Eclipse will be visible in North and South America and Western Europe and Africa; the earlier phases only in Eastern Europe and Africa.

Moon enters shadow 2h 39m a.m.
Moon leaves shadow 4h 43m a.m.
Moon sets at London, 4h 53m a.m.

IV. AUGUST 30. Total Eclipse of the Sun. Total Eclipse visible on a belt running from the South-East of Manitoba over the South of Hudson's Bay and Labrador, across the Atlantic to Leon in Spain, the Gulf of Sidra, near Thebes and Mecca, to the South-East of Arabia. Visible as a Partial Eclipse in the East of North America, the North Atlantic, Europe, North of Africa, and West of Asia.

Ends 3h 37m p.m., 37° E., 6° N.
